Public Comment:

There are in-person and remote options for members of the public who would like to participate in Council meetings.

1. In-Person:

General Public Comment:

Members of the public can speak to any item that is NOT an ordinance on the regular agenda. Members may also request that any item on the Consent Agenda labeled as quasi-judicial, be

placed on the Regular Agenda for discussion and public comment or testimony.

- Individuals who wish to speak are asked to <u>fill out a card provided</u> in Chambers and give this to
 the City Clerk. The Mayor will call people up to comment in the order the cards were received.
 Cards are only required for the general public comment portion of the meeting. Each person
 will have three minutes to speak. Public comment is limited to residents of Larimer County, and
 individuals who own property or have business interests in the City.
- Individuals who wish to speak in-person but did not fill out a card <u>may</u> have a chance to comment once all in-person and online speakers who have registered are called on, if there is any time remaining. General Public Comment is limited to 60-minutes.

Regular Agenda Items:

- No cards are required for individuals wanting to provide public comment on items included on the Regular Agenda.
- If an individual comments on a Resolution item shown on the Regular Agenda during General Public Comment, no additional comment can be given once the item comes up for discussion on the Regular Agenda.
- Once a motion is made on an item shown on the Regular Agenda, the Mayor will ask for public comment. The Mayor will invite speakers to comment at that time. In-person comment will occur first, followed by online public comment.

2. Remote:

- Members of the public who wish to provide public comment remotely, can log in using the
 meeting ID provided above, or opening your <u>meeting app or accessing the web browser</u>
 and entering the Meeting ID shown above after 5:45 pm, at which time you will be muted and
 added to the meeting.
- Members of the public can also call 1 (719) 359-4580 and enter the meeting ID when prompted: 97537796504# followed by the meeting passcode: 829866#. If you would like to speak during public comment, please press *9. The moderator will call on the users' last 4 digits of the phone number, and you will press *6 when called on by the moderator.

General Public Comment:

- Members of the public can speak to any item that is NOT an ordinance on the regular agenda.
 Members may also request that any item on the Consent Agenda labeled as quasi-judicial, be placed on the Regular Agenda for discussion and public comment or testimony.
- Remote Individuals who wish to speak are asked to register online at lovgov.org/CouncilPublicComment by 12:00 noon on the day of the meeting. The Mayor will call on people to comment in the order the registrations were received. This will follow inperson comment. Online registration is only required for the General Public Comment portion of the meeting.
- To speak to an agenda item when public comment is called for, please choose the raise your hand feature on the application. The moderator will then individually unmute the speaker and the speaker will need to follow the moderator's instructions before making comment. This will include turning on video. Each person will have three minutes to speak. The line will be muted

at the end of the three minutes. Public comment is limited to residents of Larimer County, and individuals who own property or have business interests in the City.

 Individuals who wish to speak remotely but did not register <u>may</u> have a chance to comment once all in-person and online speakers who have registered are called on, if there is any time remaining. General Public Comment is limited to 60-minutes.

CITY COUNCIL AND CITY MANAGEMENT ETHICS REGULATION PROJECT UPDATE

Information Only

The purpose of this item is to discuss an ethics policy and complaint process for the City Council and executive management level staff members. Staff is seeking detailed feedback from the Council relative to the proposed draft ordinances. Specifically, the Acting City Attorney is seeking feedback on the proposed process for addressing complaints and inquiries in addition to feedback on the substantive ethical rules the City has codified in the City Charter, or Loveland Municipal Code, or perhaps those additional rules that should be codified. This will improve, over time, the level of trust and confidence members of the public have in elected officials, appointed officials, the Municipal Court Judge, and members of City boards, committees, or commissions appointed by City Council. Also, to promote ethical behavior and sanction unethical behavior in the City.

The purpose of this session is for City Management and Finance leadership to continue updating City Council on work undertaken to address and analyze Councilmembers' comments and questions related to the 2025 "austerity budget" posed at the April 30th and June 11th Council Budget Planning discussions. Per Council's wishes, Staff continues to refine budget reduction options (2025 Austerity Budget) and will present a more detailed list of department-specific general fund reductions proposed for 2025. Staff will also present options, opportunities, and considerations for a future sales tax increase vote.
